TRASH DAY: MONDAYS STARTING JUNE 6TH

After several complaints about the change to our trash day, we pulled our collective weight and were able to get Waste Management to put us back on Mondays. We were given a credit from Waste Management of \$2 per household for the hassles of last month. This will be applied to the fees paid for the association dumpster. Cardboard will be recyclable at the curb but must be flattened and cut into pieces no bigger than 2' X 3'. Recycling will be collected weekly.

Irrigation Expansion Project to be Complete Soon

Construction is in full swing to improve the overall appearance of the neighborhood. Irrigation is being added to the area along Blue Creek between Buckskin Drive and Black Bear Trail. This area has been determined to be of greatest visual impact.

Attention Parents:

Joe Meade and his crew recently finished a new retaining wall at the beach. We ask that parents *please* talk to their kids about how you as homeowners paid for this improvement and expect your children to not damage it by moving rocks. Large rocks are strategically placed and should not be moved as they help shore up the banks of the lake.

It is also vitally important that there not be any digging in the common areas. New and old irrigation systems can easily be damaged or destroyed. Thanks for monitoring your kids!

Boats at Lake MUST be Locked



If you have a boat registered and stored at the lake, you must keep it locked to the cable whenever it is not in use by you or those you've authorized to use it. Unlocked boats create a liability issue and are being impounded. You will pay to get it back and may lose the privilege of being able to store your boat on common space.

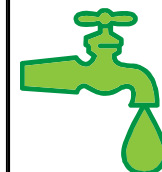
