Free Leaf Disposal

Waste Management will take up to 10 bags of leaves per household at no charge on November 9th. These leaves will go to the landfill, and NOT be composted. Please do not make the bags too heavy as their guys will need to load them manually onto the truck. Additional bags will be billed by Waste Management directly to you.



Recycle Right or Don't Bother

When trash, food, liquids and other non-recyclable items (contamination) end up in your recycling, they can ruin an entire load of good recyclable materials. Contaminated recyclables can't be reused for new products - they must be picked out and disposed instead. Plastic bags, wires, hoses and other tangles get stuck in the machinery and bring operations to a halt while workers cut them off. **Contamination raises recycling costs.** Blue Lake trash customers are ultimately paying for Recycling (whether you recycle or not) so please help keep costs down and the value of recyclables up. If you would like a large recycle cart, please email the Blue Lake office and we will order one for you.



1 Recycle clean bottles, cans, paper and cardboard.



2 Keep food and liquid out.



3 No plastic bags. Do not bag recyclables.
